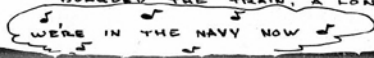

THERE WE BEGAN TO RUN INTO OUR COMPLEX PROBLEMS —

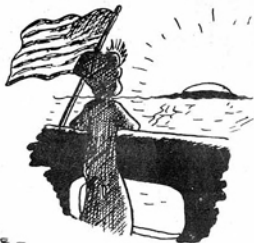

IN LINE OF DUTY...

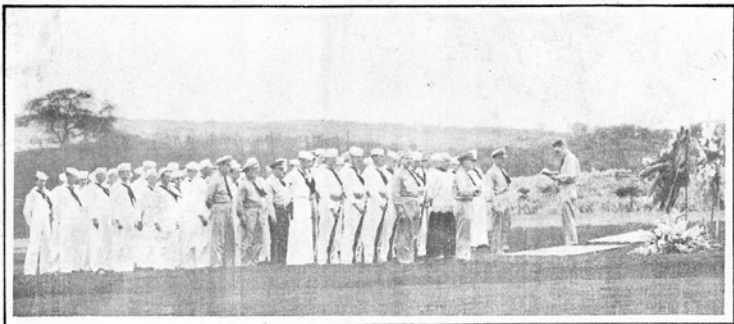
